Entry requirements (as defined by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages)

Course level A2:

Listening + Speaking: The participants (TP) can cope with simple listening and speaking situations.

Reading: TP can understand short, simple texts in everyday language.

Writing: TP can write short, coherent texts about familiar themes.

Grammar: TP must show command of present- and perfect forms, structuring of simple sentences, personal pronouns and the case system.

Course level B1:

Listening: TP can understand the main points of short listening texts when clear, standard language is used concerning mainstream topics e.g. work, school, leisure etc.

Speaking: TP can briefly explain and justify plans/opinions.

Reading: TP can find specific information relevant to a specific task in longer texts.

Writing: TP can write coherent texts relating to everyday issues and questions.

Grammar: TP must show command of the complete range of basic grammar.

Course level B2:

Listening + Reading: TP can discern main points or specific information in listening or reading texts and can recognise arguments.

Speaking + Writing: TP can express and justify opinions in both spoken and written form.

TestDaF-Intensive preparation:

Listening + Reading: TP can extract detailed information from complex, study-related listening and reading texts and use this to complete related tasks.

Speaking + Writing: TP can express opinion, agreement and disagreement in a fluent, spontaneous manner and can create clear, detailed and comprehensive pro/contra discourses in both spoken and written form.
